Water quality

Bathing spots are regularly visited during summer. In order to maintain the water quality from the Fango river, please behave sustainably :



Do not wash yourself while in the river



Do not pee into the river



Do not put sunscreen before jumping in the river

Swimming

For safety reasons, it is highly recommended to stay on the main waterway of the Fangu and not to walk all the way up its tributaries. Besides, swimming on the unsupervised Riciniccia beach (Galeria) is highly not recommended because it may be harmful in case of bad weather.

Leisure & hiking

There is a lot of hiking trails within the valley. You can also experience different kind of water activities such as kayaking on the Fangu Delta, snorkeling, scuba diving, boat rental, exploring the Scandola Nature Reserve by boat and more!




Falasorma - Dui Sevi Man and Biosphere Reserve

Created in 1977 and extended by UNESCO in 2020 the Falasorma Dui Sevi Biosphere Reserve is located on the north western coast of Corsica and includes both Fangu and Portu valleys, two rivers that flow into the Mediterranean Sea.

From a depth of 1 500 meters below sea level in the Gulf of Portu up to the highest Corsican summits with the Punta Minuta peaking at 2 556 meters above sea level, the MaB reserve presents all marine stages and typical vegetation stages of island ecosystems such as underwater rock walls, caves, beaches, maguis, forests, mountains.

Human activity is quite low, with a little more than 3 500 inhabitants spread across 12 towns (6 inhab per sq km).

The local economy is based on fishing, agriculture, crafts, local produces and especially summer tourism.



The FR 9400577 Natura 2000 site "Fango River Valley" was suggested as a Special Area of Conservation (SAC) in 1998 in accordance with the European Union's Habitats Directive 92/43/ECC also known as the Directive on the Conservation of Natural Habitats and of Wild Fauna and Flora.

The Calvi Balagne Federation of Municipalities is the overall and lead structure

This area includes a big part of the Fango watershed whose waters are home to a varied fauna:

- <u>Coastline stage</u>: pebble beach delta: alluvial forests, European community interest amphibians reptiles, rare endemic coastal plants
- Meso and Supra Mediterranean stages : international interest evergreen oak forest
- <u>Mountain stage</u>: Corsican pine forests with their flocks of endemic bird species
- <u>Subalpine and alpine stages</u> : summer pastures that are home to mouflons and Bearded vultures (rare Eurasian vulture)

The almost all Corsican reptiles and amphibians species, several bat species, the Corsican trout along with the Corsican mouflon are present on this protected site.

The concerted management of this nature site rests on a field players' network and allows elected representatives and users

to get involved for their natural heritage preservation, in harmony with mankind and its activities. European network Natura 2000 relies on European directives.
